

# Australasian Legal Education and Generative AI Showcase

### CALL FOR PRESENTATIONS

Generative artificial intelligence (AI) has arrived and law teachers are beginning to incorporate it into their teaching, assessment and academic leadership. For many of us, though, it can be difficult to know where and how to start with implementing generative AI into our education practices.

We are seeking presenters for a fully online event that will showcase a variety of examples of how generative AI has been and is being used in law schools across Australasia. This is an opportunity for law teachers at all stages of their careers to share with colleagues their successes, mistakes, learnings and how-to advice in a friendly and collegial environment. It is a "show and tell" for law teachers, so that we can learn from each other and, in particular, from those who have begun to implement generative AI in their education practices.

Presentations should be 10–15 minutes in duration and aim to be practical, so that colleagues can learn from your experience. No formal written materials are required, though slides or visual aids are encouraged.

Presentations might cover:

#### Generative AI and law assessment

- Incorporating generative AI into traditional forms of law assessment
- Generative AI leading to the creation of new forms of law assessment
- Using generative AI to develop assessment instructions and rubrics and support marking and feedback practices
- How students use generative AI in law assessment (whether permitted or not) and/or personal study

### Generative AI and law teaching

- How generative AI can be used in classroom activities for law students
- Incorporating generative AI into law teaching preparation by teachers
- Using generative AI in asynchronous learning activities

#### Generative AI and law academic leadership

- What initiatives have law schools implemented to support colleagues with varying level of tech confidence respond to the arrival of generative AI?
- How have law schools adapted assessment policies in response to generative AI?
- How do law schools engage with their broader university contexts and leaders in terms of policy changes and student support services in response to generative AI?
